- True and transparent promotion of the Association, its interests, and projects;
- Actively participate in the development of the Association, its future programs and development ideas;
- Be open to cooperate with other members, associates, and partners;
- To accept the diversity of opinions and value systems different from their own;
- Be prepared to learn and apply acquired knowledge for your own and for the general good.



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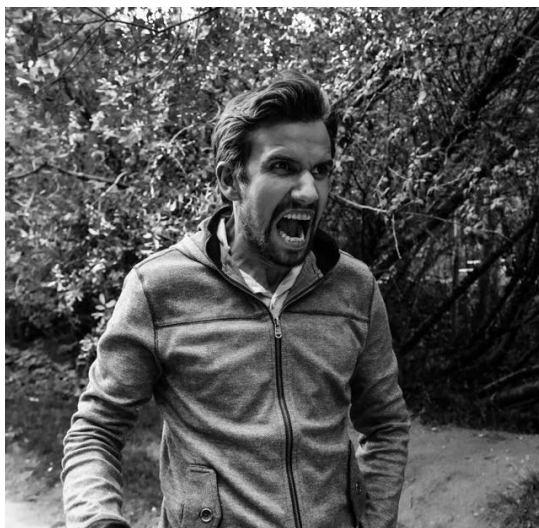
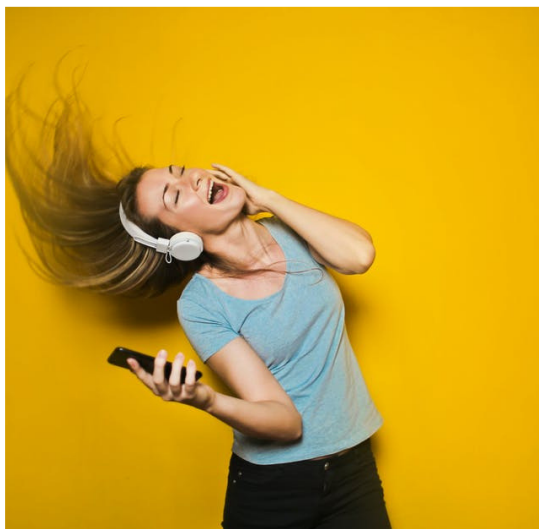
RIGHTS OF THE MEMBERS

- Equal and inalienable regardless of race, nationality, religion, gender, sexual orientation, political and other beliefs and attitudes, social status, and all other differences;
- The right to participate in all the programs of the Association with prior fulfillment of the necessary criteria;
- The right to participate in the organization, the work of the Association and the realization of the mission and program;
- The right to provide constructive suggestions and ideas for improving the work of the Association;
- The right to regular and transparent reporting on the activities of the Association and current projects;
- The right to assistance, cooperation, and partnership with all members of the Association;
- The right to be rewarded for their work, achievements, and contribution to the Association.
- The right to participate in supplementary activities organized by the Association: youth exchanges, training courses, social, cultural, sports, professional conferences, and seminars, etc;
- The right to freedom of expression in accordance with moral principles and respect the freedom and personality of other members;
- The right to access the Statute of the Association and other acts related to them, their responsibilities and rights within the Association.



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UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR:

- False and non-transparent promotion of the Association, its goals, and mission;
- Disturbing any activity in the work of the Association;
- The unjustified absence, delay or abandonment of any form of activity organized by the Association;
- Inhomogeneous and unfair relation to other members of the Association, other associates, and partners;
- False presentation and presentation of other work as your own;
- Causing material damage to the Assets of the Association;
Abolishing property or improper use of the resources owned by the Association;
- Destruction, disabling and unethical use of the information resources of the Association;
- Unauthorized access to computer system resources and actions to allow such access to the computer system of the Association;
- Causing disorder and fight or participation in disorder or fights on the premises of the Association and on projects organized by the Association;
- Coming to any form of activity organized by the Association under the influence of alcohol or any narcotic drugs;
- All other acts that are in contravention of moral norms accepted in society and acts that are legally established as criminal offenses.
